



# FISHING REPORT



**T**his weekly fishing report is compiled from information gathered from local bait shops, angler creel surveys and county and state parks staff. The report below is from July

21, the latest report available at the time of publication. For current conditions, call the Spirit Lake District Office at 712-336-1840. Most area lake temperatures are in the 80s. This week's forecast calls for continued temperatures in the 80s and 90s. Algae blooms have popped up on few area lakes, making visibility much lower. Bass and panfishing has been great on most lakes along weed lines in 10-15 feet of water. Most fish are moving out deeper as water temperatures increase.

**EAST LAKE OKOBOJI** — The water level is approximately 4 inches over crest. Fish are moving deeper post-spawn. Trolling has been working very well. Find crappie and yellow bass in 10-16 feet of water. Try fishing weed lines where there is new vegetation growth. Black Crappie — Good; Best bite is in 10-15 feet of water along weed lines. Bluegill — Good. Walleye — Fair; Try spinners, crankbaits and long and shallow shad raps in the main basins. Best bite is an hour before and after sunset. Yellow Bass — Good.

**LOST ISLAND LAKE** — Fishing/trolling is getting more difficult as aquatic vegetation reaches the surface in many places. There has been a decent-sized algae bloom lately. Black Crappie — Fair. Walleye — Slow; Try trolling crankbaits or with Lindy rigs off weed lines. Best bite is an hour before and after sunset. Yellow Perch — Fair.

**LAKE MINNEWASHTA** — Bluegill and crappie fishing has been good. Black Crappie — Good. Bluegill — Good.

**SILVER LAKE (DICKINSON)** — The late afternoon bite has been fair. Many anglers are targeting fish schools during the day. Vegetation growth and a large algae bloom is making fishing more difficult in many areas. Walleye — Fair; Try spinners, crankbaits and long and shallow shad raps.

**SPIRIT LAKE** — The lake level is just below crest. The walleye season is open. Most species are out deeper in 15-plus feet of water. Black Bullhead — Good; Try fishing the northern grade of Spirit Lake. Black Crappie — Fair; Use a tube jig and bobber. Bluegill — Fair. Walleye — Good; Use spinners, crankbaits and long and shallow shad raps; try to find weed lines. Yellow Perch — Fair; Many perch can be caught but may need to be sorted for size.

**WEST LAKE OKOBOJI** — The water level is approximately 2 inches over crest. Most fish are out deeper in 15-plus feet. Rocky points and areas with new vegetation growth have seen the most success. Black Crappie — Fair; Use crankbaits or shad raps. Bluegill — Good; Try small shad raps. Largemouth Bass — Fair. Smallmouth Bass — Fair; Try fishing off points with surface baits or jerk baits. Walleye — Fair; Try fishing off points by trolling crankbaits or with lindy rigs. Best bite is an hour before and after sunset. Some fish have been caught while trolling for crappie.





It's sure to be a time full of bright smiles and dirty clothes. The annual Lake Park Farmers Appreciation mud volleyball tournament will take place Saturday Aug. 6 near the Little League fields east of the Lake Park Community Center.

The tournament will mark its fifth year as part of Farmer Appreciation Days this year. Organizers said the inaugural 2018 games attracted about six teams, but the event managed to grow steadily in the years afterward, both in terms of participants and spectators.

Registration for this year's tournament begins at 12:30 p.m. Saturday, and teams of six will slog onto the courts starting at 1 p.m. Registration forms are available online at [www.lakeparkia.com](http://www.lakeparkia.com) and can be mailed with registration fees to Lake Park City Hall — PO Box 536, Lake Park, IA 51347. Registration for each team is set at \$100.

Each team may register up to eight players on their roster, but only six may play at any



one time. All participants must be at least 16 years old, and at least two of the six players on the court must be female. Players may only compete for one team during the tournament.

Organizers said each team will face off against all the other teams at least twice during the tournament, and each team must be present 10 minutes ahead of their games. Matches will be played to 15 points, and must be won by at least two points. Cash prizes will be awarded to the top three teams. In the event of a tie for first place, teams will play a 21-point match to decide who takes the top slot.

Organizers said corners of each court will be marked with flags, and teams will be responsible for reporting their wins.

Competitors must wear shoes at all times — organizers noted cleats are not allowed — and wearing jewelry is not recommended (though event registration forms pointed out goggles may be helpful). Matches will continue in the event of rain, according to registration information. However, if lightning is sighted, game directors may suspend, alter or cancel matches at their discretion.

# THE HULLABALOOS

ENGLISH ROCK &  
ROLL SENSATIONS  
INVADE MIDWEST

**T**he year was 1965. English bands and the British Invasion were all the rage. The charts were dominated by the likes of the Beatles, Rolling Stones, Dave Clark Five, the Searchers and Herman's Hermits. The list just went on and on.

It was not often when a band from England with a song on the radio would play a Midwest ballroom right at the height of the British Invasion. If you were lucky enough to have seen such a group, it was a real event to be at.

Imagine our surprise when we learned that the Hullabaloos from England were playing at our Roof Garden Ballroom. There must have been a lot of excited teens.

While the Hullabaloos called England home, they had a record out on Roulette Records and were appearing regularly on the Hullaballoo TV show.

The Hullabaloos were formed in 1964 by the four schoolmates when they were all attending a private school in Hull, England. Many thought that they got their name from the popular American TV show by the same name. Actually, they got their name from the town in England that they all hailed from, Hull.

The band included Geoff Mortimer — bass, Harry Dunn — drums, Ricky Knight — rhythm guitar, Andy Woonton — lead guitar and Mick Wayne — guitar. These were the members that toured throughout the U.S.

The group used long dyed blond hair as their "hook" or distinctive feature. Their hair was much longer than the other British Invasion bands were wearing theirs.

They were signed to Columbia Records in England and Roulette Records in the United States. This was the same label on which Tommy James and the Shondells recorded. They were handed off to the well-known production team at Roulette of Luigi Creatore and Hugo Peretti, aka Hugo and Luigi.

Roulette released three singles by the band while in the United States. Interestingly, they all came with picture sleeves and all came out in 1965. It was cool to show all the long blond hair on the sleeves. The releases included "Party Doll/I'm Gonna Love You Too" (Rou-



lette 4587), "Did You Ever/Beware" (Roulette 4593) and "Don't Stop/Learning The Game" (Roulette 4612). "Party Doll" was a cover of the Buddy Knox hit.

They also released two LPs for Roulette. Those were "England's Newest Singing Sensations" (Roulette 25297) and "On Hullaballoo" (Roulette 25310). Both came out in 1965.

Their sound was more in the vein of Buddy Holly, whose sound was already dated in 1965 in the U.S. as compared to other British invasion bands, but that sound had a great following in England.

They were able to get their visas extended, so they spent the better part of 1965 tour-

ing the U.S. While not touring, they appeared on numerous TV shows, including the show which shared their name, Hullaballoo. They also appeared on Shindig and Shivaree as well as Where The Action Is.

As a band, they were only together for three years. In one year alone — 1965 — they had five records released. It was such great fun for us to see and meet a true British Invasion band in person.

By 1966, the band had broken up as various members were leaving school. In 2010, most of the original members got together in England for a one-time reunion concert.

When Rebecca Peters and I were working on

our fifth edition of "Remembering Okoboji's Roof Garden Ballroom — The Rock and Roll Years," we had the good fortune of communicating with the Hullabaloos' Ricky Knight. He gave us a quote about playing at our Roof Garden Ballroom for the book. The fun part was Ricky told us the band actually had more fun in being able to stay a day at Arnolds Park and ride the rides — and of course meeting the girls.

Now, were you a part of the British Invasion when those English rock and roll sensations appeared live at our Roof Garden Ballroom on June 15, 1965?

The first TV we saw was in 1950 in Riverside, California. I had just finished receiving my MA at University of Northern Colorado in Greeley, and we took a trip to California as sort of a celebration. Our destination was Los Angeles, but we stopped at Riverside at a motel for a night. In the lounge, they had a TV set going so we watched it, fascinated. The program was wrestling featuring Gorgeous George in black and white. That was our first TV experience — 1950.

The next day we drove through Los Angeles and that night rented a motel room next to the Pacific Ocean. When we checked in, the motel owner asked us if we were there to get the Gudrun. My first thought was he was sending us on a snipe hunt like we did to naïve youngsters back in the days, but he was serious. We asked what we needed, he said a pail and a flashlight, and he went on to explain the fish came up to lay their eggs at high tide and, after laying their eggs, went back into the ocean. It was at that time we were to grab them and put them in the pail.

We went to the beach and captured over a dozen Gudrun. We asked "how do you clean them" and were told to just gut them and fry — no TV at that motel.

We taught in Greeley for three years and, in 1951, purchased a TV. An antenna had to be erected on the roof of our apartment, and we received three TV stations from Denver. The reception was great in black and white. I think we were the first among our friends, as many a Saturday evening they would come over. Popcorn was served, and we watched Sid Caesar and Jackie Gleason comedies; good clean comedy shows plus other music. It was fun and cheap as we didn't have much money. Teacher's pay in the 1950s was not much. One night our TV was on and we had a screen around our son's bed, but low and behold he was standing up in his crib peeking through the crack of the screen and watching TV.

In 1953, we moved to Mason City to teach at Roosevelt Junior High. I taught American history and geography. We were fortunate to rent a house three blocks away. We brought our TV set and antenna back from Greeley but were disappointed as we could only get one station from Austin, Minnesota. It was a real letdown after Colorado, but soon Mason

City had a TV channel. We watched TV a lot, as it was cheap entertainment.

We built a cottage on Terrace Park in 1954. It was a tenant house from Connie's folk's farm east of Wallingford. The building was 24-by-48, and we expanded its size to 48-by-48. The addition to our cottage was built the same time that the old Inn was dismantled. We needed lumber to complete the roof (sheeting) and the discarded boards from the Inn did the job. (The structure was later torn down, and the people who did it didn't realize they were looking at history.)

I don't recall how much I paid for the lumber, but it wasn't much as we didn't have much money. When Connie and I bought the lot and built the cottage we agreed to only do what we had cash for and, in the meantime, did without. Didn't hurt us and it was a pretty good investment. We had running water — ran over to the neighbors well and ran back with a pail of water. Our sewer system was a pail, post auger and a flashlight. We planted the waste up in the woods, and took our baths in the lake.

Being addicted to TV, we had to have it at the cottage, but that presented a problem. The antenna needed to be elevated and turned just

so to get reception. We solved that problem by putting the antenna on a long water pipe. I drilled a hole in the overhang, stuck the pipe through the hole and mounted the pipe on a shelf below so the antenna was up high. Just above the shelf, I put a winch on the pipe in order to turn the pipe and antenna. The antenna had to be pointed at the TV station, so I would manage the wrench to turn the pipe, and Connie would tell me if we had reception. Wow! It worked, and the boys and Connie and I had TV.

Today we have great reception and channels galore but even then can't find a good program. We love the weather channels, and I think we get more information than we need.

TV has come a long way since we watched Gorgeous George in 1950, and we now have color and great sound. I still like to watch Gun-smoke, Pickers, Public TV, Bull, Blue Bloods and America's Got Talent, and we tune into Easy Listening when we take our nap in the afternoon. I am so old that we were thrilled to get good radio stations and great "kids" programs after school, no pictures but only using your mental faculties to construct the images in your head. We have come a long ways but is it "progress?"
